Even if you don't have a library card, Beaumont Library makes accessing Wi-Fi and printing documents easy.

Whether you're at home, on the run, or maybe visiting our hometown library for the first time, Wi-Fi and wireless printing are right at your fingertips.

And so much more ...

If you sign up for a library card, you'll have free, lightning fast public computer access to the Internet — up to 50 times faster than your Internet at home.

What's it cost to print at Beaumont Library?

Only 10 cents per black and white page, and you can print from home!

If your printer runs out of ink or stops working, go to www.printeron.net/bld/library, send your print job to Beaumont Library, and release the document once you get here! Or just print from your wireless device when you are in the Library.

High-speed Internet comes to Beaumont Library

In 2015, Beaumont Library added 1-Gigabit high-speed Internet with the help of a California State Library grant. It connected the Library to a high-capacity, 8,000-mile, fiber-optic based computer network that links universities, colleges, schools and libraries throughout the state.

The California Research and Education Network (CalREN) is operated by a non-profit organization, Corporation for Education Network Initiatives in California (CENIC). Beaumont Library was one of the first 75 library jurisdictions in California to participate in CENIC.

So, what does all this mean?

Broadband benefits

With our increased bandwidth, library users enjoy many benefits.

Beaumont Library’s Internet speed, whether to your wireless device or on our public computers, is now 4,000 times faster than before the grant. And there are financial benefits, too. Grant funds paid for 90 percent of the broadband installation, and Beaumont Library is now saving \$20,000-a-year on the cost of high-speed Internet.

The Library’s increased bandwidth gives faster access to web-based resources such as Ancestry.com and Automate, a car repair database. Beaumont Library’s website also provides in-home access to databases such as HeritageQuest Online and even remote checkout of e-books through OverDrive, e-audio books through RBDigital (formerly OneClick Digital), and digital magazines from Zinio.

Did you know it’s also possible to track your library account and renew materials from home? And to be notified in advance when material you checked out is coming due?
